My earliest church memories connect with music. I remember singing the doxology long before I considered the words: "Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Praise God all creatures here below..."

I also have a random handful of children's songs that pop into my head from time to time—songs that I recognize now as actual Bible verses. As a child, I had no clue that I was singing scripture, but it's fun to open my Bible now and read verses that automatically have a melody.

Sacred songs connect us to memories:

- "Here I am Lord" always reminds me of my call to pastoral ministry.
- "The Old Rugged Cross" was my grandfather's favorite and "Swing Lo, Sweet Chariot" is a song I used to sing with my daddy, so I think of them each time those pieces are played.
- Once, I preached a funeral where "Jesus Loves Me" was part of the eulogy because each of the now-grown children remember their mom teaching that song at bedtime.

I use songs in prayer—borrowing lines and lyrics to settle myself into sacred moments. "Center" by Charlie Hall and "Heart of Worship" by Matt Redman are both songs that help bring me peace after stressful days.

Sacred music is also interesting. (Did you know that Duke Ellington is in our hymnal? Or that "O Holy Night" was written as part of the abolitionist movement? Did you know that "In the Garden" is meant to be from Mary's perspective as she encounters the risen Christ outside of the empty tomb?)

This June and July, we are launching a summer sermon series based on sacred songs and hymns. If you have a favorite hymn (or a particular song that pops up in your prayer life)—let us know! I would love to curate a church playlist of RPUMC favorites!


