
Lent is the journey of transformation; from ashes and sin to life and victory in Jesus. From our mortality and fragility to the overflowing and everlasting life of Christ.

This year, Lent will begin on February 14th (Ash Wednesday) and end on Easter Sunday, March 31st.

This Lent, we will follow Bishop Tom Berlin's new book (The Third Day: Living the Resurrection). Each week of Lent looks at a different character in Scripture (like Mary Magdalene and the apostle Paul)—digging deep into ways that the story of Jesus changed and transformed their lives.

My own hope and prayer is to arrive at Easter with a deeper hope and a clearer witness pf my own personal story of hope and resurrection in Christ.

2024 Lenten Challenge (4 ways to grow in faith):




Read the book. <u>The Third Day: Living the Resurrection</u> by Mark A. Miller and Tom Berlin. One chapter each week focuses on Bible characters whose lives changed because of Jesus' resurrection (The church will order copies for anyone who wants to participate. Some of our Sunday school classes will discuss it as well)



Reflect on the power of resurrection in your life (Reflection cards will be available throughout the season, encouraging each us to answer these questions: How does the resurrection of Jesus impact your life? How has your life been resurrected (transformed) because of Christ's resurrection? Answers can be anonymous. Our hope is to send everyone home on Easter Sunday with a devotional from these responses)



Join a Lenten prayer group. (The idea is to pray daily and text weekly with two or three other persons who are doing the same. It's a great way to connect with new people in the church and hold each other up for spiritual growth and encouragement. Contact the church office or Kevin Round for more information)



Pick a spiritual discipline. (Some people fast or give up things like chocolate or soda for the days of Lent. Some choose to 'pick up' a new spiritual discipline for the 40 days—like starting each day with spiritual music or practicing sabbath rest in a new way. The season of lent is a perfect opportunity to take a next step in spiritual growth).



As always thank you for your prayers and support and now bins overflowing with your donations of cold weather gear. --Bonnie D






THE AMANDA BETHANY STRONG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
