In a "kids club" lesson last month, our kids learned the John 11 story of Lazarus. (Lazarus is a friend of Jesus who dies, but is brought back to life—pointing to Jesus as the resurrection and the life.) In a particularly dramatic moment, the grave is opened (despite fear of what it may smell like) and the now-alive Lazarus stumbles into the light—still covered in grave clothes. Jesus says to those around Lazarus: "*Unbind him, and let him go.*'

Similarly, when the disciples found the grave empty on that first Easter morning, Jesus' linen wrappings had been folded up and left behind.

There is an element of faith that calls us forward, beyond our grave clothes. For me, moving forward in faith involves recovering from perfectionism. Overcoming a competitive spirit. It's about trusting that "what is" can have worth and life and meaning as it is (without needing to wrap it up in something false). Unwrapping those things from my life is a mark of God's grace at work in me.

As followers of Jesus, we are Easter people.
Jesus calls us out of the grave and forward in faith. Unbound. Unwrapped. Set free from sin and death...


